





Autumn 1 – Art & Design (painting)

<p>Drawing: a picture made with a pencil, pen, or crayon rather than paint</p> <p>Infill: fill a space</p> <p>Line: a narrow continuous mark; the edge or contour of a shape.</p> <p>Outline: a line by which an object or figure is or appears to be bordered.</p> <p>Realistic: shows true to life</p> <p>Scale: relative or equal size.</p> <p>Shape: the form of an object defined by outline.</p>		<p>Picasso at 18 years</p>
