Maths



This half term we will be learning to:

- Understand doubles and halves
- Count in multiples of 10
- Add and subtract 10 to a multiple of 10
- Use known facts within ten to add multiples of 10.
- Count to 100 and beyond.
- Count tens and ones.
- Compare numbers to 100.
- Recognise, find and name a half as one of two equal parts of an object, shape or quantity.
- Recognise, find and name a quarter as one of four equal parts of an object, shape or quantity.

Maths gym

This half term in maths gym sessions we will be:

- Continuing partioning odd and even numbers and using this to subtract
- Composing teen numbers into ten and a bit
- Comparing and ordering teen numbers
- Writing equations using correct symbols

Physical Education

In Year 1 the children will have one PE session each week. This will include both indoor and outdoor PE.

Forest School sessions may include active games, creative activities and teach the children about managing risks, outdoor safety and how to care for the natural world. All children will need to come to school in their usual school uniform on Forest School days, ensuring that their arms and legs are covered. School trousers and a top with a cardigan/sweatshirt is ideal, If the weather is wet, we will provide your child with an all-in-one suit to wear. If you have your own suit, please feel free to send it in with your child in a named bag. Please use our class welly racks to store boots



Phonics

Through our daily phonics lessons we will learn to:

This half term we will be learning to:

- participate in discussion about what is read to us, taking turns and listening to what others say:
- explain clearly our understanding of what is read to them:
- listen to and discuss a wide range of stories and non-fiction;
- spell words containing the phonemes (sounds) taught;
- say out loud what they are going to write about:
- compose a sentence orally before writing it;
- form lower-case letters in the correct direction, starting and finishing in the right place;
- join words and join clauses using and;
- punctuate sentences using a capital letter, a full stop or question mark where appropriate;
- write from memory simple dictated sentences.

PSHE
