

2 - What has been going on in school?

Preschool

This week, we have been extremely busy! We made and tasted pancakes on Shrove Tuesday. We have explored magnets; finding out how a magnetic field works and naming different materials (e.g. metal, wood, plastic etc). We experimented to see if these materials were 'magnetic' or not.

Of course, we also celebrated **World Book Day** with a host of stories such as 'The Gingerbread Man' and 'Izzy Gizmo', **constructing** with a range of boxes and being **involved** with science experiments!

Next week, we will begin planting seeds so any **empty pots** such as clean yoghurt pots would be appreciated.







Year R

This week we have enjoyed sharing **photos of our pets** and finding out about different types of animals e.g. pets and wild animals. We have looked at range of famous U.K landmarks e.g. Big Ben, The London Eye, The Angel of the North, Buckingham Palace, White Cliffs of Dover and Stonehenge.

Next week we will be thinking how **Huntingdon** is different to London. If you have visited London with your family, **please share any photos you might of your trips have via Tapestry**.


We will also be making observations of and talking about the kinds of wild animals that live in the U.K such as badgers, foxes and hedgehogs.












This week, in English we started to look at our new text **'Giraffes Can't Dance'**, and we discussed new vocabulary. In maths we solved subtraction stories, **please look out for this in**


your homework this week! We have begun to use the program <u>'Scratch Junior'</u> in computing. **Next week**, in **art** we are infilling shapes using the techniques hatching and scribbling.

Year 2

This week, we wrote a character description about **'Traction Man'**, our Superhero, who is a bit of a show-off! We learnt a method to add 2-digit numbers together by splitting the tens and ones, before recombining. In computing, on <u>Scratch Junior</u>, we found out that even when a sequence of commands are in a different order, the outcome will be the same.

Next week, we will learn methods for subtracting 2-digit numbers. We will listen to another story by the author Mini Grey, 'The Pea and the Princess'. In art lessons, we will practise stippling and blending using charcoal and pencils.





This week, we have been exploring time in maths, using physical clocks to help us think about minutes past and minutes to, the children have shown some great perseverance with this. In science we sorted foods into the correct category on our "Eatwell Plate" and discussed how to keep our bodies healthy. We really enjoyed **World Book Day** and becoming little inventors for the day, the children planned and created some fabulous inventions! **Next week**, we will be looking at narrative writing in English and continuing our work on our tennis skills in PE.

















This week, we wrote a character description about a character of their choosing, from our class novel, **'Charlie and the Chocolate Factory'**. In Maths, we learned about coordinates, focusing on the X and Y axis and plotting different shapes on a grid. **Next week,** we will be making biscuits in **DT**. A polite reminder that **PE** is on **Wednesdays and Fridays**, as it has always been. **Sorry for any confusion!**











This week, we have been planning a diary entry as if we were Michael from our class novel **'Kensuke's Kingdom'**. We also had a very interesting **NSPCC** workshop. The children were **involved** and asked lots of great questions.

Next week, we will be starting our **adventure in the hall**, we know it will be strange initially but are **optimistic** that we can settle into a new routine up until Easter. We will also be writing a diary entry linked to our class novel.



Year 6

This week, we have studied properties of circles and angles in triangles in maths, as well as writing diary entries in English using informal language choices. In geography, we have been learning about Jamaica's diverse climate and we started to learn about healthy foods and exercise (manger et bouger) in French.

Next week, we will be learning about the structure of the heart in science and are looking forward to dissecting a heart with Mr MacLennan from St Peter's Secondary School.
