Session 1	WALT be able to talk about what is special in their lives. Show pupils a 'special box' with some special things inside. Can anyone guess what might be inside? Reveal items with a sense of awe and wonder. Explain why each object is important. It may be a reminder, a memory, a symbol of important person etc. Pupils look at special objects but ask how they should handle them. What is they got dirty or broken? How would the teacher feel? Discuss how we should treat other people's special things. In small groups/talk partners, ask the children to talk about their special things. Feedback ideas. TA write observations for Tapestry. During Cool Time teacher take small groups of children to explore their special box and talk about what is special in their lives. Record on Tapestry.	Session 1	WALT recap that there are different types and times for celebration. Revisit celebration box from Term 1 session 2. Ask children to choose an artefact and describe what it is used for. Which celebration would it be used for? Add some Christmas artefacts to the box .Ask the children 'Does anyone know when these would be used?' I remember Explain in the next couple of week's people all round the world will be celebrating Christmas. In cool time encourage the children to show what they already know about Christmas? Teacher to take photos and record on Tapestry.		
Session 2	WALT be able to talk about an important time in their life. Show children a variety of artefacts from a celebration box to stimulate discussion e.g. birthday cards, wrapping paper, Eid cards, Diva lamps, Easter cards, Christmas cards etc. See RE resource boxes. Do the children recognise anything? 'I remember' 'I know' In small groups/talk partners, ask the children to talk about a special time they have had in their life. Feedback ideas. TA write observations for Tapestry.	Session 2	WALT share what we already know about Christmas. Invite children to share what they have made in Cool Time. Create a class mind map of things we know about Christmas. Ask 'what would you like to find out about Christmas?' (prompt the question 'why do we celebrate Christmas?') TA write observations for Tapestry.		
Session 3	WALT know a birthday is a special event and how it may be celebrated by some. Read Kippers birthday by Mick Inkpen. Why do you think Kipper wanted to celebrate his birthday? It's Stripes' birthday. What can we do to help him celebrate? Make a class list. 'I remember' E.g. party, invitations, party food, cards, gifts,	Session 3	WALT know that Christmas is special to Christians and the main reason for this Tell Christmas story (see video on smart notebook) Ask the children 'Who is in the Christmas story?' – Mary, Joseph, Jesus, Angels, Shepherds, wise men What are Christians celebrating at Christmas?

Session 4	WALT know that Diwali is an important festival for Hindus. Return to celebration box from session 2 and show Diva lamp. What do you think it is used for? Tell the story of Rama and Sita (see PowerPoint). Explain that Hindus have a special festival called Diwali. It is a festival of light because it reminds people of the happy ending where good won over bad. Make a Diva lamp using clay and decorate using sequins. Take photo for Tapestry.	Session 4	WALT understand how Christians celebrate Christmas Watch cBeebies video – Let's celebrate Christmas. Ask 'does anyone do any of the things in the video at Christmas'? - go to church, give presents to a charity, advent calendar, setting up nativity scene. I remember Cool Time Challenge – create a giant nativity scene. On a large roll of paper with stable outline on, children draw characters from the nativity. Teacher to continue videoing children acting out Christmas story. End of session show giant nativity picture. Sing birth of Jesus Jump for Joy song
Session 5	WALT recognise that there are different types and times for celebration Recap which celebrations children are familiar with and have taken part in. 'I remember' Return to celebration box from session 2 and show Eid card. Tell me something about it. Have you seen something like this before? Compare to Christmas/birthday card. Explain that Muslims celebrate Eid and send cards as part of the celebration. Different groups of people have celebrations at different times of the year: Hindus celebrate Diwali in late Autumn, Christmas is celebrated in December, Muslims celebrate Eid at the end of Ramadan.	Session 5	WALT to find out about Christmas traditions In talk partners children discuss 'What do people do to celebrate Christmas?' 'In my family we' 'At Christmas we' Feedback ideas. Revisit celebration box – pick out Christmas cards. Ask children 'does anyone know what this is?' I remember Ask children 'How would you feel if you got a Christmas card'? Explain we are going to make a card for someone special. Make Christmas cards
